Co-producing social policies with Social Solidarity Economy actors to fight poverty, inequality and social exclusion

MedTOWN is a social innovation project that aims to support the role and the capacities of the Social Solidarity Economy actors in fighting poverty, inequality, social exclusion and environmental unsustainability through the research and experimentation of a co-production model with the use of public complementary e-currencies for the provision of social services and financial aid to the most vulnerable groups in order to increase the socioeconomic impact and effectiveness of public policies and the transparency of expenditures at local level.



The **3** pilars of MedTOWN's activity:



MedTOWN will provide a capacity building programme that will be a transformative pathway with dynamic, fresh and inspiring materials to strengthen the abilities and skills of the participants in developing local public-private partnerships for the provision of social services promoting human wellbeing.

> Social Experimentation Action Research Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E)

A series of **experimental actions deploying a co-production model** will be undertaken in an effort to increase the effectiveness of social services and public expenditure. In parallel, a M&E framework will be developed to **measure the socio-economic impacts** through action research in order to provide specific recommendations for policy design.



The **MedTOWN Community of Practice** (CoP) (cop.acpp.com) is the main tool for people-topeople communication in the project. It will be a space for inspiration, mutual e-learning and interactions on social innovation in the co-production of social services, as well as a platform for policy dialogue with critical reflections among professionals in the public social sector, local policy, citizenship and research in the SSE sector, while linking with other CoPs in the field of sustainable communities and eco-social innovation. The main objective of MedTOWN is to promote co-production initiatives for municipal policies in collaboration with Social and Solidarity entities in the Mediterranean basin.

Co-production empowers citizens by collaborating in the development, design and delivery of a specific public policy, together with public authorities.

Co-production generates more resilient and sustainable societies, as participation enables citizens to include their concerns and social inclusion as it increases their sense of belonging, improves social cohesion and builds social capital. Meanwhile, the process is more cost-effective for the administration, guaranteeing the traceability of public money, verifying the suitability of the expenditure in a fast and constant way, and at the same time simplifying the administrative work, shortening the circuit in time by saving steps in the procedure between the administration and the people using the service.

Multiplier effect of Complementary Currencies

The use of **local and complementary currencies (CCs)** can turn an aid programme into **a programme of local economy promotion**. Using these instruments, subsidies not only cover the basic needs of the population, but **amplify the economic impact of the expenditure**. CCs favour the local commerce and encourage recirculation in the local economy, which **increases the multiplier effect of public spending**.

CCs do not seek to replace but rather **complement the national monetary system by supporting the local markets and economies**.


